Following the Lincoln Memorial, you will visit the Vietnam Veterans and Korean War Veterans Memorials. The last stop will be Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial. All of these monuments are spectacular on their own but once illuminated at night they are truly a site to see.

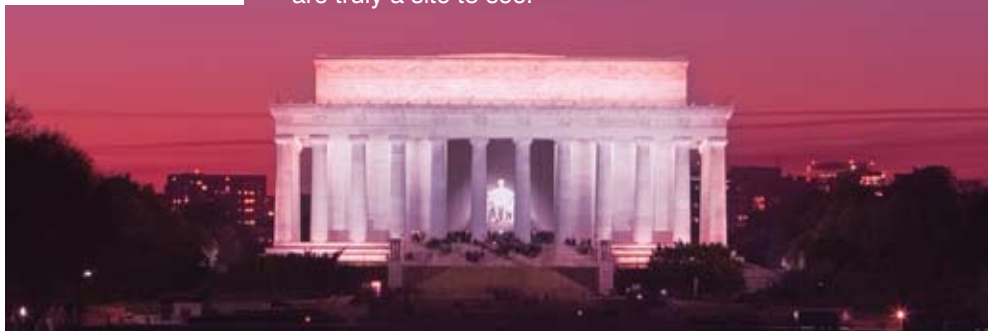


Tuesday, October 21

Mount Vernon & Old Town Alexandria
10:15 a.m. – 4 p.m.**

Cross over the Potomac River to Mount Vernon, America's most visited historic house. Situated on a slope overlooking the Potomac River, this magnificent estate offers you the opportunity to travel back in time to the eighteenth century to take a glimpse at the authentic life of George Washington, the first U.S. president. While at Mount Vernon, enjoy a guided tour that will include the plantation's outbuildings and gardens. Following Mount Vernon, you will head to Old Town Alexandria, a formal colonial port that is now a revitalized waterfront with cobblestone streets, colonial houses and churches, museums, shops, and restaurants. *Lunch at the Mount Vernon Inn will be included.*

Optional Tours

Saturday, October 25

Garden and Great Estates: A Visit to Hillwood Mansion and Tudor Place

9:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. (lunch on your own)

Situated in Northwest Washington, Hillwood Estate is a lush enclave in the middle of the city. Marjorie Merriweather Post, heiress to the Post cereal fortune, purchased the 25 acre estate overlooking Washington's Rock Creek Park in 1955. She then commissioned a massive renovation of the mansion and gardens, and Hillwood was transformed into a breathtaking architectural masterpiece by renowned New York architect Alexander McIlvaine.

In 1805, Martha Custis Peter began building Tudor Place with an \$8,000 legacy from her step-grandfather, George Washington. The imposing neoclassical mansion is surrounded by 5.5 acres of lawns, parterre and woods designed by the Peters and Dr. William Thornton, the first architect of the U.S. Capitol. The estate exhibits many items from Mount Vernon plus early American silver, sculpture, textiles and manuscripts, as well as a guest book that reads like a Who's Who of 19th Century America. Guests will also enjoy strolling in the gardens that lie just outside of the mansion, including the landscaped "Flower Knot" and "Box Circle."

The International Spy Museum

9:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. (lunch on your own)

Through interactive exhibits with state-of-the-art audiovisual effects, film, and hands-on components, the International Spy Museum traces the evolution of espionage through the people who practiced the profession, and provides a context for visitors to interpret the role that intelligence plays in current events. Visitors will adapt a cover, break codes, identify disguised spies, and become the subjects of covert surveillance throughout their visit at the Spy Museum.

Smithsonian

Museums on the National Mall

9:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. (lunch on your own)

Spend the morning exploring Washington, D.C.'s most popular monuments and museums. Tour guides will be available to provide commentary, brochures and information about each monument and museum. You will have the full time to explore any of the museums or monuments you prefer, including the Smithsonian Castle, the Air and Space Museum, the National Museum of the American Indian, the National Gallery of Art, the National Museum of Natural History, and the Newseum.



Smithsonian National Zoological Park

2 p.m. - 6 p.m.

Take this opportunity to visit one of the best zoos on the East Coast. The National Zoological Park offers the beauty of nature along with all the refinement that comes with being part of the Smithsonian Institution, including interactive exhibits and 163 acres of natural habitats. From leaf-cutter ants to Asian Elephants, the National Zoo features 2,800 individual animals of 435 difference species, including two adorable giant pandas and Amazonia, an enclosed tropical habitat where animals roam freely in a canopy of live trees. The National Zoo is well worth a visit, and is an ideal tour for adults and children alike.



A Tribute to Our Nation's Heroes

2 p.m. - 6 p.m.

As a tribute to America's heroes, visit the Iwo Jima Memorial, Air Force Memorial, and Arlington National Cemetery. The Iwo Jima Memorial is a tribute to American military valor. The statue depicts one of the most famous incidents of World War II, modeled after a photograph taken in 1945 on the island of Iwo Jima. As the newest memorial, the Air Force Memorial's design is truly representative of flight and the flying spirit of the men and women in the U.S. Air Force. Your stop at the Arlington National Cemetery includes the Women in Military Service in America Memorial, the first major testimonial honoring women who served in the U.S. armed forces, the Tomb of the Unknown soldier, guarded 24 hours a day and a monument to those American soldiers who remain unknown, and the grave site of President John F. Kennedy, crowned with its ever-flickering Eternal Flame.
